WHERE: HOLIDAY INN IN OKEMOS

TIME: 6:00 pm Friday, January 13 through 6:00 pm Sunday, January 15, 2011

COST OF RETREAT ONLY - \$68.00
(includes cost of the sewing room, dinner on Saturday and lunch on Sunday)

COST OF HOTEL ROOM - \$ 107.35 per night includes all taxes and fees. This price is for up to two people per room. If you add a third or fourth person it is an additional \$8.00 a night per person. Call the Holiday Inn at 517-349-7800 to reserve your room. Be sure to mention you are an LAP member.

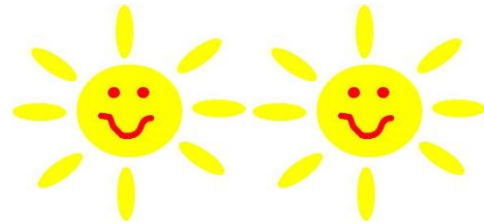

QUICK TIPS

Get a good quality flannel backed tablecloth at a dollar store and tack or use painter's tape to attach it to a wall or back of a door for a quick design wall. The quilt pieces stick and may be rolled up and still have the design in place when unrolled (in

case you want to sew at a later date or new location).

Remember, we do not have UFOs, we have RFTs (ready to finish).

2012 Quilt Show

We need a few more volunteers to collect quilts for the quilt show. We could use someone on the west side/Grand Ledge area and Laingsburg area.

Duties as a Volunteer to be a Drop Off Point

1. Each drop off point will have a color designated to them. A ribbon or strip of material of that color will be pinned on the pillowcase of all collected quilts. For example: Maxine's color in the past has been red. Maxine would pin a red ribbon or strip of material to all of the pillowcases of all the quilts she collected. This color would help sorting the quilts after the show is over, so people will go to the correct pick up table at the hotel.
2. Make a list of all incoming quilts. Included on the list should be the name of the person and name of the quilt.
3. Each quilt will be pre-assigned a spot in the show where it will be hung (by Beth Haubenstricker). You will be provided with an index card to put on each of the collected quilts telling where the quilt will be hung. This will take place after the deadline for all quilts to be turned in.
4. After all of the index cards are on the quilts you can sort them by what row they will be hung. Bundle them together. When you deliver them to the quilt show you can drop them off by group in the row they will be hung.

5. After the show you will be responsible for all the quilts you collected. Most everyone will pick them up from you at the end of the show. Any not picked up at the show you will take home and contact the person so they can come after them.
6. If enough people volunteer no one will be responsible for over 100 quilts. Don't let that scar you because most will only collect 50 or more.

COMMIT TO HANG FORMS

When entering a quilt into the quilt show a Commit to Hang form must be filled out. These forms are on line and are very easy to fill out. When completed on line they are automatically sent to both Evelyn Bochenek and Beth Haubenstricker. Evelyn is making the Quilt Show Label for each quilt and Beth is arranging where the quilts will be hung. To fill out the Commit to Hang form:

- 1) Go to LAP website.
www.LansingAreaPatchers.com
- 2) In the left hand upper corner click on "forms".
- 3) Click on Commit to Hang under On Line Version.

4) Fill out the form. We need the dimensions of the quilt or article being entered so we know where to put it in the show. The statement can include what kind of quilt or article it is ie; paper pieced, hand quilted or something about the quilt/article ie; made for graduation. This will be information will be included on the Quilt Show Label by your quilt/article.

5) When the form is completed click on "submit".

6) This is a chance for you to review your form and make any changes, if necessary.

7) Click on "enter".

8) A small box comes up so that if you have more quilts/articles to enter you can do so without going back to the website each time.

If you do not have access to a computer, hard copies of the form will be available at the LAP meetings.

Commit to Hang forms must be submitted by April 1, 2012.
