creative direction. Your response to the Christmas block exchange was so enthusiastic --- let's keep it going!

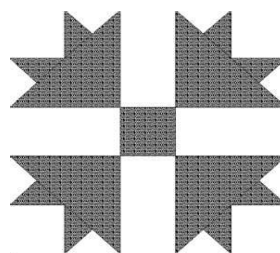

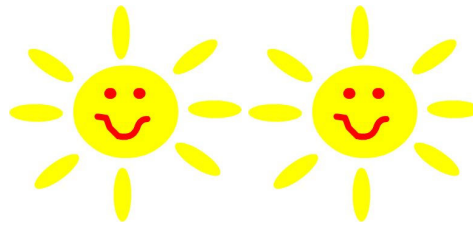

BROWN BAG CHALLENGE

The Brown Bag Challenge is an activity that allows each of us to explore our creative quilt making talents.

Participants select fabrics of their choice, place them in a "Brown Paper Bag," and bring them to the November 1st, 2012 meeting. During the meeting, if you bring a bag, you are allowed to select a bag. You take the bag home and make up a quilt top (top only) with the fabrics from the bag you selected following the rules outlined below. It is fun and can be challenging to work with fabrics outside of your own comfort zone. The tops are collected, and the makers present to the owners the quilt tops at our April 4th, 2013 meeting. Remember that it is a challenge, be creative and have fun. Please consider being part of this fun, challenging activity.

2012\* Brown Bag Rules \*2013

1. Place 6 fat quarters of cotton fabric in a small brown paper bag.
2. On the outside of the bag, write the letter that corresponds to your choice of design approaches.
  - A. ALLOW ONE - The maker may add NONE, or ONLY ONE fabric of their choice along with those you have placed in the bag, to complete the quilt top for you.
  - B. BE CREATIVE - The maker may add NONE, or AS MANY fabrics as they choose along with those you have placed in the bag to complete the quilt top for you.

**WHERE:** HOLIDAY INN - OKEMOS

**TIME:** 6:00 PM, Friday January 13, through 6:00 PM, January 15, 2012

*(We might be able to get in a little earlier on Friday night, but will let you know, as we get closer to the retreat date)*

**COST OF RETREAT ONLY** - \$68.00 (includes cost of the sewing room, dinner on Saturday and lunch on Sunday)

**COST OF HOTEL ROOM** - \$107.35 per night (includes all taxes and fees). This price is for up to two people per room. If you add a third or fourth person it is an additional \$8.00 a night per person. Call the Holiday Inn at 517-349-8700 to reserve your room. Be sure to mention you are a LAP member.

### RETREAT ACTIVITIES

#### FRIDAY EVENING PICNIC

- Beginning at 6:30 p.m., we are having a picnic. Bring your favorite picnic food to share as well as your own drink. Shirley is providing the desserts. Table service provided.
- **GARAGE SALE** - Bring in your garage sale items (priced and with your name on them) and share with your fellow quilting friends. This activity will continue throughout the weekend.
- **SNACKS** – There will be a table set up for snacks that you are willing to share with the group.
- **Block Blotto** – Think Snow-Stitch. **12 in. finished** blocks in any pattern using a show

theme. No fabric will be distributed, simply make blocks that remind you of show. Make as many blocks as you like. You will get a ticket for each block. There will be a drawing on Sunday for the blocks. Last year we had enough blocks to draw three winners to share the blocks. Be creative and have some fun!



#### SATURDAY –

- Breakfast is served, if you stay at the hotel. Otherwise you are on your own.
- Lunch is on your own, however, you may want to eat very light as dinner will be a great buffet.
- Dinner Buffet – 5:30 p.m. served by the hotel and is included in the cost of the retreat. This will be a large meal with your choice of two different entrees with several side dishes as well as dessert.
- **Speed Sewing Challenge for Charity** – Bring nine 4 ½ in. squares to compete in this fun challenge. Work in groups or alone, fastest done wins a prize. The blocks we make will be made into a quilt for charity at a later date.
- **Fun Hat Challenge and Parade** – decorate a hat of any kind and keep it a secret if you can. Plan to parade your hat on Saturday evening to compete for a prize in three categories – Most Embellished, Most Quilt-like and Best of Show. Retreat goers will be voting and prizes given out Sunday morning.
- **Show and Tell** – All day long – Bring your own design wall as demo'd at a future LAP meeting.
- **Garage Sale** – All day long

**SLEEP IN SUNDAY** – Not really – get up as early as you want or sleep in.

- Breakfast is served, if you stay at the hotel. Otherwise you are own your own.
- **Fun Hat Challenge prizes awarded.**
