

You will need:

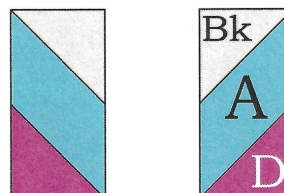
- 48 rectangles of Fabric A measuring 2 ½" by 4 ½".
- 48 squares of Background Fabric measuring 2 ½".
- 48 squares of Fabric D measuring 2 ½".

Instructions

1. Place a Fabric A rectangle horizontally on your work surface. Place a Background Fabric square on top of the Fabric A rectangle as shown, having the right sides together and the raw edges even.
2. Draw a diagonal line as shown directly on the background square.
3. Stitch directly on the line you have drawn.
4. Trim, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.
5. Press the seam in the direction of the orange arrow to complete the first part of your clipped corner unit.
6. Rotate the clipped corner unit 180° so that the background fabric triangle is in the lower left corner of the unit. Following second set of illustrations, repeat the process from steps 1 through 5 using a square of Fabric D to clip the upper right corner of the unit. Press the seam toward the triangle as indicated by the orange arrow. Make 24 units.
7. Working with the remaining Fabric A rectangles, Fabric D and background fabric squares, clip the corners in the opposite direction of the units completed in steps 1 through 6, but placing the Fabric A rectangle vertically on your work surface. This will result in mirror image units.

These units will measure 2 ½" by 4 ½" including seam allowance.

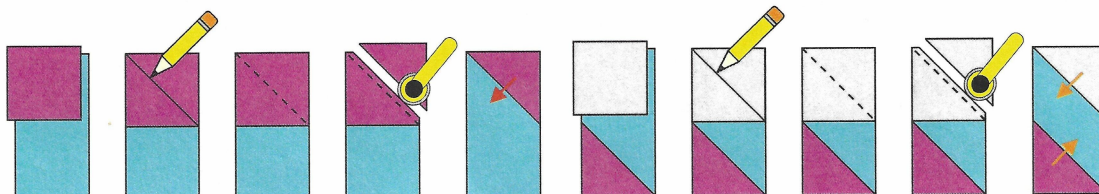

Tip:

Placing the Fabric A rectangle vertically on your work surface for the second set of units will alter the direction of the angle.
