2016-2017 Quilt Challenge for LAP

This year's challenge is to design a quilt portraying a postage stamp of your choice. It can be any topic you like, but preferably something that has meaning to you. It can be a flower, place, building, an animal or pet, famous person, car or boat. However if there is a special stamp that has a special meaning, you can do an interpretation of that stamp. The colors are your choice, but it must look like a US postage stamp. The size of the quilt must be between 12 inches by 18 inches and no larger than 48 inches by 36 inches, shaped like a postage stamp. The quilt must be quilted and bound, a finished quilt. It must be done by the May 2017 meeting and displayed at the May 4th meeting.

We sure hope you will participate! Have fun!

DIRECTIONS FOR MEMBERS ONLY ACCESS TO THE LAP WEBSITE

- 1. Go to the website: www.lansingareapatchers.com
- 2. Click Sign In right side in the top banner
- In the screen, enter your user code (the letters from your email address that fall in front of the @. Example: my email is kkhanselman@comcast.net. Enter only kkhanselman – not case sensitive.)
- 4. Check the Check for a New Password box.
- 5. Click Submit
- 6. Your password will be emailed to you at your email address.
- 7. After receiving your emailed password, go back to www.lansingareapatchers.com. Click Sign in on the right side of the upper part of the page. Enter your user code (see #3 above) AND your newly issued password. The site will remember your password.
- 8. Once you've signed in a new menu item is displayed in the menu list (upper left) called **Members Only.**
- 9. Click on **Members Only** to see the items on file.

MS affects over 400,000 Americans by disabling the central nervous system. So to help aid research the board has voted to make blocks for MS this year. The individual blocks will be mailed in and from there put together, given to patients or auctioned off to raise money for research. The directions for block construction are given below. Quilt Block Guidelines:

Size of quilt block to be sent in are 12 ½" x 12 ½" (31.8cm x 31.8cm). This is to allow volunteers to use a ¼ foot to piece blocks. Blocks can be pieced, embroidered, appliquéd, crazy or a combination of techniques

Unfinished Quilt blocks ONLY. No additional batting, stabilizer or interfacing. This will make piecing easier and cut cost of shipping. We will have blocks quilted on a long arm machine.

PLEASE DO NOT CUT DOWN THE BLOCKS TO 12" X 12". They will be too small to piece.

The main color of the quilts will be bright orange and bright green this is the color of Multiple Sclerosis Awareness. The awareness ribbon is orange. Additional colors that can be used for accent are yellow, purple and any background color should be white.

Any block made will be used. We will happily incorporate all blocks. We will not discriminate.

Please include your name, address and contact details with your block. If your block has a name or the inspiration behind the block please include it and any other information you would like to include and if you are dedicating it to anyone.

Please make as many blocks as you like, this will be an ongoing project.

This is a work in progress and I hope your family, friends, sewers and quilters will all band together to keep this block party going.....
