IMPORTANT LIBRARY INFORMATION Over the past couple of years we've lost some library books. These are part of our guild resources and we need to deal with them responsibly. The board has set up the following method to deal with overdue and/or missing books.

- 1. Books are checked out for one month. Books can be renewed.
- 2. For overdue books the fines are:

\$1.00 per book for one month past due.

\$3.00 per book for two months past due.

\$5.00 per book for three months past due.

After four months, the member pays the full price of the book for replacement.

Notice:

If the member cannot attend the guild meeting, she must notify the librarian before the meeting or the day after the meeting to avoid a fine.

As librarian, I will attempt to send out reminder emails to members before the meeting regarding the books that have been checked out.




Quilt Show

The quilt show has two positions still open. One for ribbons and one for our new "Pick and Pay" booth. Kay and I were discussing the fact that Bea Hughes did a fabulous job on the ribbons for our 2014 Quilt Show and therefore she would be a very hard act to follow. So here's what I suggest we do. I would like to ask each LAP member to create a beautiful 4" block in either Purple (Best of Show), Blue (First Place), Red (Second Place), Yellow (Third Place) or Floral/or/white (for Honorable Mention). I personally would like white as the only other color added, with the predominate color purple, blue, red, yellow or floral/or/ white. We could set a sew-in day to make these blocks into ribbons. Plus we should have extra ribbons left over to give the Challenge Coordinator ribbons to place on her challenge quilts.

I also have some ideas for the "Pick and Pay" booth. As this will be our first adventure into the selling of sewn articles, we want to keep the items very simple and NOT to compete with any of our vendors.

MSU and U of M themed items always sell.

The Quilt Show committee will give you lots of support, so please consider taking on either one of these positions.

Lansing Area Patchers 2015 Winter Challenge Guidelines

This winter's challenge, which will be voted on by members at our May 2015 meeting, is to make a quilt with a log cabin block or blocks. Not all the blocks in the quilt have to be a log cabin, but there must be at least one log cabin block on the front of the quilt to qualify for the challenge. All interpretations of the log cabin style block can be used.

To qualify your quilt must

- be at least a total of 60 inches in circumference
- have one or more log cabin blocks on the front of the quilt
- be quilted or tied and the binding complete The Challenge Quilts will be displayed and voted upon by the guild at our May 2015 meeting.


