LAP has two service projects. We make doll quilts for the Salvation Army to give with wooden doll beds at Christmas.

Doll quilt sizes are

18"x25" made without batting to be soft and pliable. Our commitment for 2009 is 400 quilts by the December LAP meeting. At the moment we have 111.

LAP also makes quilts for the children at Ele's Place. Sizes for these quilts are: 42"x60." Last year we contributed 37, but our commitment is 25, due to Georgiana Viele by May. We hope to hang some of these quilts at our Quilt Show. The public should see how much beautiful work goes into these donations.

Right now we are in need of smaller items such as hot pads, coasters, mini-wallets, etc. Since the economy is difficult for many people right now, we are hoping that some smaller, less expensive items will enable more bidders. The goal is to collect about 60 items.

UFO Rescue

The 2010 Quilt Show Committee has proposed this new booth for the May show. Here is a way to get unfinished objects (UFO's) out of your house and off your guilt list. Take a look at your UFOs and admit to yourself which ones you know you'll never ever finish. It doesn't matter why. Maybe you got stuck with a technique, misplaced the pattern, ran out of one of the fabrics, inherited someone else's UFO, simply lost interest, or have a couple of orphan blocks that didn't make it into a quilt top or an entire quilt including the fabric to finish it all the way to the binding. Package these up in a way that clearly displays all the pieces and parts, including the pattern if it's available. Use a ziplock bag, a shoe box with the fabrics displayed on edge or the clear plastic bags that bed linens come in. Fill out the "UFO Rescue Form" as completely as you can. Clearly display the inventory form in the package and turn it all into Chris McEnhill.

After helping sort through a couple of different estates the past few years, trust me, your children will truly thank you for purging before you “kick the bucket.” One person’s UFO can be another person’s treasure and think of all the precious memories it could be making somewhere else instead of sitting at the bottom of your closet tied up in a plastic bag.
